

If you need a lift to the hospital - we can help?

Are you feeling lonely, and keen to make a new friend - we can maybe help?

NeighbourCare has a fleet of mature DBS checked volunteer drivers across Basingstoke, Tadley and nearby villages, ready to help older local folk no longer able to drive or lacking the mobility they once had to use public transport.



NeighbourCare also has a group of experienced and carefully screened "befrienders" able to drop in and provide friendship and support where you might no longer be able to see others as much as you used to.

Our drivers can typically take people to Hospital appointments, visit their Doctor or Dentist, travel to and from a day centre or exercise class or on a shopping trip, for a small donation towards our running costs.

If invited to do so, our befrienders visit lonely and isolated 'neighbours', who perhaps suffer from reduced mobility or increasing isolation. Care is taken to pair up people with similar interests who can then drop in regularly to have a chat over a cup of tea, thereby helping to keep their neighbour more fully engaged with the world.



### Camrose, Gillies and Hackwood (CGH) Patient Participation Group (PPG) News

Dear Local residents,

Here is our latest monthly PPG bulletin. We hope you will find it helpful and interesting.

We ask that we all "Be kind and respectful to each other". Throughout the pandemic, our NHS staff have gone above and beyond to help our nation tackle COVID-19. This has been a difficult time for everyone, including the teams in our local practices who have had to deal with lots of changes in the way they work and with high demand for GP services. This can cause frustration, and some staff have experienced abuse during this time which is of course upsetting for them and is not acceptable.

We would like to take this opportunity to extend our thanks and appreciation to CGH staff for continuing to provide patients with a good service, under very difficult circumstances.

The new website is now up and running after a bit of a delay. It can be found at <a href="https://www.cghpartnership.co.uk">https://www.cghpartnership.co.uk</a>. Please visit the website (About Us -> Patient Participation Group) to read the minutes of our last meeting with the Practice held on 11<sup>th</sup> August.

**EConsult is no longer mandatory**. If you are unable to complete this, you can now ring the surgery and a receptionist will complete it for you. You can choose to use E-Consult if happy to do so, and for non-urgent appointments. There are now two reception teams meeting demand for phone, or on-line, giving improved service and flexibility for whichever option is preferred. You can use the **Ring Back service** 'press 1 facility' when telephoning, which works well and saves listening to repeated messages.

**CGH have been chosen to run a Breast Pilot Scheme** for 30+ year olds, who are experiencing breast pain or, who have found something unusual, such as a lump. You can now contact their surgery, and be seen on the same day, and be referred directly.

### **OTHER NEWS**

GPs are now contacting 16/17yr olds for Covid vaccination appointments. If anyone is having difficulties getting to appointments, it is possible to walk into clinics. Take up for vaccinations in the 18/29 age group could be improved, so please encourage friends and family to get vaccinated, as it protects you and the wider community.

Long Covid is recognised as a severe problem for those affected. CGH are signed up to the National Enhancement Service designed to support those patients. Symptoms vary between patients, and help can be found in various ways. The British Lung Foundation is a non-profit making organisation and offers help for rehabilitation where breathing difficulties are an issue. The Aquadrome are offering a service where staff have been trained by CAWS Inclusive Learning to help people with muscle weakness caused by Long Covid. A programme is put together for individuals using gentle exercise to rebuild muscle strength. Membership, or payment by session, would be required. Other local gyms may also provide this service.

**N.B.** Each patient experiences different symptoms, and this may not be suitable for everyone. It is important to note that this programme has not been tested by the practice.



### Summer holiday break-ups and family mediation

For many families the summer holidays are the best time of year. This is especially so for children when they can spend some quality time with their parents.

Unfortunately, this is not always the case as for many people the summer break can reveal cracks in a relationship that were previously papered over. Indeed, spending a great deal of time together when a marriage is already on rocky ground can often be the final straw as has been proved to be the case by many in the pandemic.



It makes me incredibly happy to see friendly faces refilling bottles and jars. By being one of these friendly faces you become a role model for friends, family, neighbours, and colleagues. In September, the Heart & Compass will have environmentally friendly baby products for the new mums in Basingstoke. Did you know that the average baby gets through 4,000 disposable nappies by the time they're potty-trained, costing families £400 a year and creating the equivalent of half a tonne of carbon dioxide?

What's next? The second converted stable, which is currently getting a lick of paint, will be stocked with loose

teas, coffees, herbs, and spices. Dried goods, pasta, chickpeas will follow and

then refillable wine, beer, and spirits. Come on over!


