Year 7 Transition 2022

We are looking forward to welcoming our Year 6 students. On the 1st March 2022 parents with children in Year 6 will be informed of their child's Secondary school placement. We are eager to welcome the students who will be joining Cranbourne in September 2022. We are very proud of the transition process that is in place here at Cranbourne which ensures students can move from Year 6 to Year 7 as smoothly as possible. This is a big step and at Cranbourne we aim to make new students feel as comfortable as possible in their new environment. Transition packs will be sent out at the beginning of March and our New Intake Parents' Evening is on Wednesday 16 March 2022 at 6.00 pm. Our Transition Co-ordinator, Ms Corrigan will then begin her visits to the primary schools after Easter. We are planning to offer on-line lessons for our new intake students, as we have done previously. These have proved to be very successful.





Camrose, Gillies and Hackwood Partnership (CGH) Patient Participation Group (PPG) Newsletter

Dear all,

With a growing need for mental health support for the patient population, CGH have put in place a mental health team and resources, which include the following:

Employed a GP, Dr. Webster, specialising in complex mental health patient care;

A mental health nurse (CPN), to support a range of issues from acute crisis to longer term problems;

MIND clinics run twice weekly for signposting patients and self help support with a Mental Health Adviser from MIND;

Mental Health Multi-disciplinary Teams (MDT) working with local mental health services and consultants;

Focus on mental health through staff communications, and training in understanding of the Mental Capacity Act (MCA) legislation;

Shared resources for healthcare professionals on available mental health support for patients during the pandemic.

In addition, CGH are working with Southern Health to recruit a further Mental Health clinician. We would encourage patients who need support to contact the surgery for appointments, and to make full use of their services.

The PPG are delighted to announce that Matt Holman from Simpila Mental Health is guest speaker at our first PPG/Patient Open Meeting, on a date to be confirmed as soon as Covid uncertainty allows. We will invite patients to come and meet the PPG over coffee and cake, and hear Matt talk about mental health, with a chance to ask him, and the PPG, any questions. Covid Vaccinations for House Bound Patients, who are vulnerable, have mobility problems, and are unable to attend clinics, can be arranged by contacting the CGH surgery by e-consult or telephone for a home visit.

Complaints Procedure: Everyone at CGH works hard to meet patient needs. Inevitably, sometimes things go wrong. Patients are encouraged to use the Feedback/Complaints procedure at https://cghpartnership.co.uk/about-us/comments-and-complaints/ CGH have a full-time Complaints Manager, Wayne Robinson. Complaints should be acknowledged within 3 working days will be fully investigated, and a targeted, final response should be sent within 40 days of receipt.

FINDING HOPE

Most people would probably agree that life can have challenges, difficulties and disappointments. Sometimes these can be almost overwhelming. In my work at our local food bank, it is my great privilege to be the face representing the generous people of Basingstoke who have kindly donated the food. All of us who volunteer there agree that we want to do more than give our clients a generous supply of food; we want to 'signpost' them towards other sources of help and support.

I often get into good conversations with clients and can identify these other ways of help, for example about housing, employment, finance or mental health. We really want our clients to leave the premises carrying not only food in their bags but hope in their hearts that there is 'light at the end of the tunnel'.

But there is also something else, another perhaps deeper well of hope. At the foodbank we have our 'prayer book'. In this book we write a short prayer for anyone who welcomes this. It asks God to help in any way that's requested. Then dozens of our prayer supporters ask God for that help on their behalf. Most clients are really happy for this, and also accept a free little booklet entitled 'Try Praying' that encourages them to do it themselves. We believe this increases hope and positive benefit.



January and February can be difficult months for many people but by the time you read this in March I hope there will be spring flowers in our gardens, parks and hedgerows, lengthening days and the promise of brighter, warmer times ahead! The hot cross buns and Easter Eggs will have been on the supermarket shelves for weeks — just to remind you that it will soon be Easter!

The Church looks forward to Easter as the central festival on which the heart of our Christian faith is based. 
