


Both of our community buildings are becoming vey busy so there is lots of choice if you are wishing to join an activity.

Details of these are further inside the magazine and include a new Beginners' Pilates that is starting this month.

Easter was wonderful here at the centre. We had around 300 of you attend for our trail, tombola and cake sale, as well as activities that Hannah ran through the holiday. It was so lovely to see so many of you. This was shortly followed by other events such as our craft fayre, mediumship event, open mic nights, indoor boot sales, cribbage and Ukulele Jam. Never a dull moment with Viables Community Association.

March saw the launch of our Weigh and Play sessions at the Roger Morris Centre, Eastrop and we have over 120 local families in our group, with around 30 families attending per week. This session is currently FREE and open to anyone with a baby who would like the opportunity to weigh their child accurately and meet other parents in the area. April saw the start of an additional Memory Club session running on a Thursday afternoon, due to a high need for our services. The summer brings us some exciting changes as we look forward to having the roof of the main building replaced. Due to its age, we have had many little leaks and we are having the work done by BDBC so that they don't turn into larger leaks! This means that there will be a little bit of disruption to some activities between July and the end of September but we have liaised with all of our regular hirers to ensure this runs as smoothly as possible with minimal disruption to all of our wonderful users. The work will be carried out in two phases so at least one of our halls will be open at all times. In addition, we are refurbishing our Osborne Room in September too! We are creating a disabled toilet space, extending the unit so we have additional storage and redecorating the whole space to create a more comfortable and accessible feel for you all. Please bear with us while we continue to develop and maintain our community spaces for everyone's benefit.

CGHB News

During a recent meeting with CGHB/Operose, it was agreed that a second Meet the Patients meeting with Maria Miller MP, would take place during the summer 2023. Maria Miller has confirmed she will be facilitating this meeting. Date to be confirmed. Future Operose newsletters are scheduled to include details on issues in respect of Dr iQ training videos, and an explanation of the Team of Teams initiative for patient awareness.

Call wait times are starting to improve, and work continues in this area. There are general staff recruitment problems, with the national shortage of GPs causing difficulties. In line with NHS policy, CGHB proactively recruit other clinical roles, such as Advanced Nurse Practitioners, pharmacists and paramedics to provide a multi-disciplinary clinical team giving as many appointments as possible for patients. CGHB also use the NHS ARRS scheme, which provides funding for additional clinical roles, and draws on central support teams, i.e. pharmacists, to support their practices.

If a health matter is causing concern, and patients have difficulty contacting the surgery for an appointment, the 111 service is allocated a limited number of appointment spaces at CGHB and, depending on urgency, are able to contact the surgery to arrange a telephone appointment, the same day.
