We have also set up the Hot Spots. These are warm spaces that are intended to help those who may be feeling cold in their own homes. We have had an overwhelmingly fantastic response in gaining volunteers for this, for which we are very grateful. We have had some attendees but we are always welcoming more. So if on a Wednesday every fortnight, you feel like joining us for some hot soup, some warm bread and a cuppa while you chat to others, then please call in. 



"Museums are not static but dynamic": thus wrote George Willis, (1877-1970) Basingstoke shopkeeper, antiquarian and local historian, one time mayor, first Freeman of the Borough, and, in 1931, the founder of the Borough Museum that evolved into the justly named Willis Museum, now run by Hampshire Cultural Trust (HCT) and called the Willis Museum and Sainsbury Gallery. Visit the Museum's website and you will clearly see that it lives up to Mr Willis's wise dictum in no uncertain fashion.

With high profile touring exhibitions in the Sainsbury Gallery, frequently changing exhibitions by local people and groups in the Basingstoke Community Gallery – this could be you or your group - and its programmes of talks, workshops, and family activities, you can go there many times a year for a new experience every time. As a fund-raising body it recently handed HCT a substantial sum towards a forthcoming re-display of the *Story of Basingstoke Gallery*, the area dedicated to the history of the town.

CGH & Beggarwood PPG Newsletter, November 2022

Patient Participation Group Update

As some of you may know, the Beggarwood Surgery is now run by Operose/CGH. Since this acquisition, the two PPG's have been under pressure to merge, and this has now taken effect. With this merger, we believe we will be stronger together, and have formed a management type quorum, consisting of the Chairs and Vice Chairs of both PPGs. We are now the largest PPG group under the Operose flag. We mean to make full use of our dealings with Operose and, if need be, NHS England.

Along with monthly meetings with local and central Operose management and CGH, we will run separate monthly PPG members' meetings, which will be minuted and published on the PPG website: www.cghppg.co.uk. Inserts will be published across all Parish magazines, and the Basingstoke Gazette.

As part of our remit, we will concentrate on two key areas with the surgeries, i.e. telephone answering times, and patient complaints. You can help us monitor this, and press Operose for effective action. We ask you to tell us your experience when trying to contact CGH by phone, by filling in a quick, easy survey, which can be found on the PPG website address above, and has been widely circulated on social media sites.

Complaints: Operose employ a full-time Complaints Manager. If you feel you have reason to complain about your experience when dealing with the surgery or a member of staff, you should register your dissatisfaction via the CGH website: www.cghpartnership.co.uk/about-us/comments-and-complaints You should receive a response and/or an acknowledgement, within 3 working days, plus a formal reply and solution, within 40 working days. If you are dissatisfied with the way they have dealt with your complaint, you can contact the independent healthcare assessment authority, Parliamentary and Health Service Ombudsman on 03450154033 or via their website: www.ombudsman.org.uk

Surgeries Update: Operose has introduced a trial telephone answering system consisting of a number of options, designed to reduce the issue of call queues, which will be reviewed daily. Option 1 is for urgent calls/action. It is important to avoid the temptation to press 1 regardless of the nature of your call, and respect the trial call system. Other options direct you to Prescriptions, Referrals, Medical Secretary and Deceased Reporting. Staff sickness continues to cause delays.

8325 patients have received the flu vaccine. Invitations have been sent out by text, letter or, mobile phones. Some letters were received unfranked, and CGH will refund any postage costs incurred.

Problems have been experienced with prescriptions at Boots @ Beggarwood and Lloyd's @ Sainsbury. There is a known issue with the Boots' App, and these problems appear to be with the pharmacies, not the surgeries.

Current feedback for Dr.iQ is mixed. Let us know your experiences via our email. There are 2 ways of contacting the PPG - email: Beggarwood.surgery@btinternet.com or, cghppg@gmail.com or, website: www.cghppg.co.uk. Over the next few months, the email addresses will be merged, to avoid confusion. You can contact us to tell us your experiences on any issues of concern, feedback on services, helpful suggestions, etc. This is purely for non-medical feedback. For urgent medical problems, contact the surgeries directly or ring 111.
